#### Routes to Pärnu:

- Via Baltica motorway (E67), the most important highway connecting the Baltic countries
- Airport Pärnu airport has a certificate for international flights but operates only between Estonian islands

Charter flights from different cities of Finland: 23.04-21.05 and 20.08-24.09

- The Port of Pärnu is the main sea gateway to South Estonia
- The Päru yacht harbor was the first one in Eastern Europe to receive the Blue Flag
- Railway today its is only connection




## It all began...

### Short overview of the history of Pärnu:

- 9000 BC The first settlement at the mouth of the Pärnu River was established,
- 1251 The first written record of Pärnu,
- 1838 The first bathing establishment was opened in Pärnu,
- February 23rd, 1918, The Estonian State Independence was declared from the balcony of the theatre Endla,
- 1926 Pärnu was named a "vacation and therapy center" of national importance,
- 1940 -1991 Pärnu as the whole of Estonia belonged to the Soviet Union,







- 1992 The Museum of New Art in Pärnu was founded,
- 1996 Pärnu was declared the Summer Capital of Estonia,
- 1996 Pärnu College of the University of Tartu was opened,
- 2004 Estonia joined the European Union and NATO,
- 2006 The Beach Promenade was opened,
- 2010 The Beach Park (*Rannapark*) and Pärnu Yacht Club were reconstructed.

- Pärnu has 12 twin and 7 partner cities in Europe and USA
- Pärnu is a member of Union of the Baltic Cities


#### **Reasons to visit Pärnu:**

- Number of visitors in 2010: 980 000



Project: Restoration and Public Access of Coastal Habitats in Urban Environment "Urbancows"

### Goal:

The overall goal of the project is to improve the favourable conservation status of the coastal meadow and lagoon habitats in City of Pärnu as well as the species characteristics to this habitat complex.

### **General information:**

- Partners: The Environmental Board, Pärnu City Government, University of Tartu Pärnu College
- Funding:
  - Total cost: 1 138 413 EUR
  - Requested European Union contribution: 853 809 EUR
  - Beneficiaries' contribution: 284 604 EUR
- Area: 250 ha
- Project period: 2012-2016







### **Actions involved:**

- Cleaning unwanted vegetation (i.e. reed and brushwood)
- Preparing area for grazing, building fences and other infrastructure necessary for grazing
- Restoring the natural hydrology of coastal lagoons
- Establishing visitor infrastucture (trails, observation platforms, etc)
- Raising awareness of local community and visitors of the city about nature values
- Raising awareness of decision makes in other similar areas (urban pastures)








## Daily life is much more severe

- In January 9th, 2005, an unseen storm attacked the Pärnu Bay.
- Sea-level raised about 3 metres.
- 700 houses were caught by the cold sea water in the town of Pärnu.
- 500 farms were flooded in Pärnu county.



The blue line marks flood up to 2,5m, the red line marks rise of sea level up to 3 metres.

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Sunday morning, January 9th, 2005, in Papli Street.





The same morning, the ice from the Baltic Sea arrived in Seedri Street.

On the left bank of Pärnu River there are wide areas for future development. What could be our challenge if the world economy won't brisken?






The Beach Park, a state nature protection area as well as a state heritage area, located between the seaside and the riverside, could be a nice place for an international cultural park.

The first Estonian newspaper Perno Postimees was born here in 1857. The paper is published until today. The birthplace of the paper and the poetess Lydia Koidula has survived, not the surroundings.





Between Koidula Museum and the riverside, there is located a huge sawdust port which makes the area very noisy and dusty.





As the export has slowed down, there are more silent days at the harbour.





The only bridge in the town center is a gateway from Pärnu to Tallinn.





The quay in the town center was closed for shipping a dozen years ago but hasn't found any new goal.





The oldest linden alley in town, planted in 1875, takes you to the first gymnasium from where many state leaders of Estonia took off for their life work.





In Kuninga (King) Street, the world famous scientist Georg Wilhelm Richmann was born in 1711. He was one of the first researchers of electricity and was killed by lightening in 1753.





History? No, it is a brand new apartment building in the old town of Pärnu.





The Museum of New Art domesticated the former district headquarters of the Communist Party and tries to ...





...rebuild it into a real international art center.





In January 2012, there are the latest paintings by Juri Arrak on show. His Last Supper revises an old and traditional theme of many artists of previous centuries.
